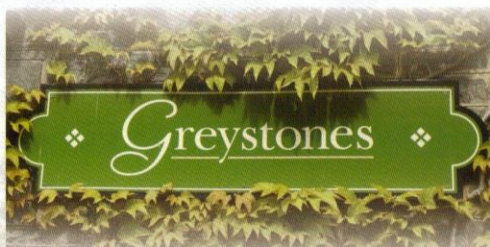

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Greystones enjoys an enviable quiet location with splendid views of the surrounding mountains, yet is only a three minute walk to the pedestrianised centre of Keswick, with its many shops, cafes, traditional pubs and restaurants.

Built as a gentleman's residence in 1863 from the most handsome local stone from Honister slate quarry in Borrowdale, Greystones now offers high quality accommodation in the heart of the Lake District.

All bedrooms are en-suite and each room has a flat screen TV, radio, hair dryer, tea/ coffee trays and complimentary bathroom toiletries

There is a pleasant sitting room and seating area to the front overlooking St Johns church, and private car park to the rear.

The old market town of Keswick, often described as the jewel in the crown of the Lake District, is situated between the two lakes of Bassenthwaite and Derwentwater, and is surrounded by the most majestic mountain scenery.

Many walks can be started from our front door, whether it's a low level amble or access to the high fells. There are also daily guided walks which start from the town centre.



Just a short stroll away is Lake Derwentwater, pass by the new Theatre by the Lake and on to the boat landings, where the Keswick Launch Company operate a daily service, around the lake, rowing boats can also be hired from this point.

There are many ways to enjoy this beautiful landscape, walking is by far the most popular but the surrounding area can also be easily explored by car, bike or bus, from winding country roads to the thrill of travelling over England's highest and steepest mountain passes

Other activities include: sailing, canoeing, pony trekking, windsurfing, paragliding, 9 & 18 hole golf courses, mountain biking, fishing & photography For a less strenuous day why not take a scenic tour, or visit one of the many attractions from wildlife parks to art galleries or historic houses and gardens.

Hadrian's wall and the Scottish Borders can be reached within the hour, as can the most southerly aspects of the Lake District making Greystones in Keswick the perfect base from where to explore and enjoy this fantastic region
